

FALL LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE DRESS CODE

Dress Code: DECA Casual

(Applies to All Advisors & Students)

Attendees are expected to represent their chapter and DECA professionally.

Required Attire:

- DECA chapter t-shirt or school-appropriate spirit wear (must be appropriate and non-offensive)
- Jeans, pants, or khakis that are school appropriate
- Closed-toe shoes are recommended for safety and comfort

Acceptable Guidelines:

- Jeans/pants must be free of rips, holes, fraying, or distressing
- Shorts are not recommended unless specifically approved by the advisor and must follow school dress code guidelines
- Leggings/joggers are acceptable only if they are not overly tight, see-through, or worn as sleepwear

Not Allowed:

- Ripped, torn, or distressed jeans or pants
- Pajamas, slippers, or sleepwear of any kind
- Clothing with inappropriate language, graphics, or imagery
- Tank tops, crop tops, or excessively revealing clothing
- Flip flops or slides (to ensure safety in conference spaces)

Additional Expectations:

- This dress code applies for the duration of the conference unless otherwise specified
- Advisors are responsible for ensuring their students follow the dress code
- Participants not in compliance may be asked to change into appropriate attire

 ✓ PANTS Jeans (no holes), khakis, chinos, or casual pants.	 ✗ OFFENSIVE CONTENT Clothing with inappropriate language, graphics, alcohol, tobacco, vaping, drug-related, or offensive content is not allowed.

 ✓ SHORTS School-appropriate shorts are acceptable	 ✗ NO VISIBLE UNDERGARMENTS Undergarments may not be visible above clothing.

Dress Code: DECA Casual

(Applies to All Advisors & Students)

Attendees are expected to represent their chapter and DECA professionally.

Required Attire:

- DECA chapter t-shirt or school-appropriate spirit wear (must be appropriate and non-offensive)
- Jeans, pants, or khakis that are school appropriate

RED ZONE DRESS CODE DECA CASUAL

THIS APPLIES TO BOTH ADVISORS AND STUDENTS.



ACCEPTABLE ATTIRE



CHAPTER T-SHIRTS

Chapter T-Shirts are encouraged.



DECA APPAREL

Arizona DECA or DECA apparel is encouraged.



PANTS

Jeans (no holes), khakis, chinos, or casual pants.



FOOTWEAR

Athletic shoes, tennis shoes, or closed-toe casual footwear.



SHORTS

School-appropriate shorts are acceptable



NOT ACCEPTABLE



NO HOLES OR RIPS

Jeans or pants with holes, rips, or excessive distressing are not allowed.



INAPPROPRIATE CLOTHING

Crop tops, tank tops, tube tops, or revealing clothing are not allowed.



OFFENSIVE CONTENT

Clothing with inappropriate language, graphics, alcohol, tobacco, vaping, drug-related, or offensive content is not allowed.



NO PAJAMAS

Pajamas or sleepwear are not allowed.



NO VISIBLE UNDERGARMENTS

Undergarments may not be visible above clothing.



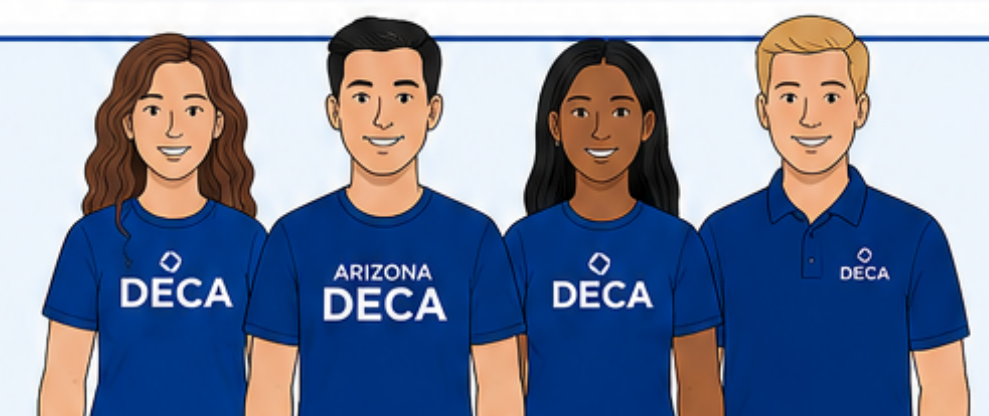
NO SWIMSUITS

Swimsuits are not allowed except during designated water activities.



ADVISOR EXPECTATIONS

Advisors should also follow the DECA Casual dress code and serve as role models for students throughout the conference.



CAMP DECA DRESS CODE

Dress Code: DECA Casual (Applies to All Advisors & Students)

Camp DECA attire is designed to be comfortable, fun, and school appropriate while still representing professionalism.

Day 1 (Arrival Day): DECA Casual

Required Attire:

- DECA chapter t-shirt or school spirit shirt
- Jeans, pants, or khakis that are school appropriate

Guidelines:

- Clothing must be free of rips, holes, or distressing
- No pajamas, slippers, or sleepwear
- Closed-toe shoes are recommended

Day 2: Color Team/Spirit Day

Required Attire:

- Shirt, top, or outfit representing assigned team color
- School-appropriate bottoms (shorts, jeans, athletic wear, or pants)

Guidelines:

- Shorts are allowed but must be appropriate length (no excessively short shorts)
- Tank tops are allowed but must not be overly revealing (no low-cut or crop-style tops)
- Clothing must be appropriate for a school setting and free of inappropriate language or graphics
- NO Excessively revealing clothing (including very short shorts, crop tops, or see-through items)

Day 3 (Final Day): Camp DECA Shirt

Required Attire:

- Official Camp DECA t-shirt (provided)
- Jeans, pants, or school-appropriate bottoms

Guidelines:

- Same expectations as Day 1 apply

General Expectations (All Days):

- Attire must always follow basic school dress code standards
- Clothing must be appropriate for a professional student leadership environment
- Advisors are responsible for ensuring students are dressed appropriately
- Participants not in compliance may be asked to change

CAMP DECA DRESS CODE DECA CASUAL

THIS APPLIES TO BOTH ADVISORS AND STUDENTS.



DAY 1: ARRIVAL DAY

DRESS CODE: DECA CASUAL



ACCEPTABLE

- ✓ Chapter T-Shirt
- ✓ Arizona DECA or DECA apparel
- ✓ School-appropriate jeans, shorts, or pants
- ✓ Athletic shoes or closed-toe footwear



NOT ACCEPTABLE

- ✗ Clothing with holes, rips, or excessive distressing
- ✗ Crop tops, tube tops, revealing tank tops, or excessively short shorts
- ✗ Clothing with inappropriate language, graphics, alcohol, tobacco, vaping, or drug-related content



DAY 2: COLOR TEAM DAY

DRESS CODE: COLOR GEAR



ACCEPTABLE

- ✓ T-Shirts
- ✓ Team jerseys
- ✓ Athletic shorts
- ✓ Jeans, pants, or school-appropriate shorts
- ✓ Athletic shoes
- ✓ Color-themed accessories

While Color Team Day allows for more creativity and spirit wear, clothing must remain appropriate for a school-sponsored event.



NOT ACCEPTABLE

- ✗ Excessively short shorts
- ✗ Crop tops, tube tops, sports bras worn as tops, or revealing clothing
- ✗ Clothing with inappropriate language, graphics, alcohol, tobacco, vaping, or drug-related content
- ✗ Swimsuits outside of designated water activities



DAY 3: DEPARTURE DAY

DRESS CODE: OFFICIAL CAMP DECA SHIRT



ACCEPTABLE

- ✓ Official Camp DECA T-Shirt (provided at camp)
- ✓ School-appropriate jeans, shorts, or pants
- ✓ Athletic shoes or closed-toe footwear



NOT ACCEPTABLE

- ✗ Clothing with holes, rips, or excessive distressing
- ✗ Inappropriate or revealing clothing
- ✗ Clothing with offensive or inappropriate content

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS



Camp DECA is a school-sponsored leadership conference. Clothing should be appropriate for all conference activities.



Advisors are expected to follow the same dress code standards and serve as role models for students.



Arizona DECA reserves the right to determine whether attire is appropriate for the conference environment.



Students or advisors not meeting dress code expectations may be asked to change into appropriate attire.

DISTRICT CONFERENCE DRESS CODE

Dress Code: Business Professional (Applies to All Advisors & Students)

Participants are expected to present a polished and professional appearance appropriate for a business environment.

General Expectations:

- Clothing must be clean, neat, and well-fitted
- All attire must be appropriate for a professional, school-related environment
- No jeans, shorts, t-shirts, athletic wear, or casual footwear
- Closed-toe dress shoes are required

Expected Business Professional Attire:

- **Tops:**
 - Collared dress shirts, button-down shirts, or professional blouses
 - Sweaters or cardigans layered over professional tops are acceptable
 - Ties or professional neckwear required when wearing a collared shirt
- **Bottoms:**
 - Dress slacks or khakis
 - Business-appropriate skirts or dresses (must be at or near knee length - no more than 2" from knee)
- **Footwear:**
 - Dress shoes, flats, or closed-toe heels
- **Optional (Not Required):**
 - Blazers or suit jackets (encouraged but not required at District level)

Not Allowed:

- Jeans, denim of any kind, or distressed clothing
- Sneakers, flip flops, slides, or casual sandals
- T-shirts, hoodies, or athletic wear
- Clothing that is overly tight, revealing, or inappropriate for a professional setting

Additional Expectations:

- Advisors are responsible for ensuring students meet dress code standards
- Participants not in compliance may be disqualified

DLC DRESS CODE BUSINESS PROFESSIONAL

✓ BUSINESS SUIT

✓ DRESS SHIRT OR BLOUSE
Button-up dress shirt or professional blouse.



✓ DRESS SLACKS
Dress pants in black, navy, gray, or khaki.



✓ SKIRT OR DRESS
Professional skirt or dress at or below the knee.



✓ PROFESSIONAL SHOES
Dress shoes, flats, or heels.



✓ SWEATER, CARDIGAN OR BLAZER
Acceptable to wear over dress shirt or blouse.



✓ OFFICIAL DECA BLAZER
Optional.

STATE CONFERENCE DRESS CODE

Dress Code: Business Professional
(Applies to All Advisors & Students)

Participants are expected to present a polished and professional appearance appropriate for a business environment.

General Expectations:

- Clothing must be clean, neat, and well-fitted
- All attire must be appropriate for a professional, school-related environment
- No jeans, shorts, t-shirts, athletic wear, or casual footwear
- Closed-toe dress shoes are required

Expected Business Professional Attire:

- **Blazer Requirement:**
 - A blazer or suit jacket is required for all participants
 - Blazers do not need to be official DECA blazers, but must be professional in appearance. Blazer is required when appearing on stage
- **Tops:**
 - Collared dress shirts, button-down shirts, or professional blouses
 - Blouses must be appropriate (not low-cut, sheer, or revealing)
 - Sweaters or cardigans layered over professional tops are acceptable
 - Ties or professional neckwear required when wearing a collared shirt
- **Bottoms:**
 - Dress slacks/Dress pants
 - Business-appropriate skirts or dresses (must be at or near knee length - no more than 2" from knee)
- **Footwear:**
 - Dress shoes, flats, or closed-toe heels

Not Allowed:

- Jeans, denim of any kind, or distressed clothing
- Sneakers, flip flops, slides, or casual sandals
- T-shirts, hoodies, or athletic wear
- Clothing that is overly tight, revealing, or inappropriate for a professional setting

Additional Expectations:

- Advisors are responsible for ensuring students meet dress code standards
- Participants not in compliance may be disqualified
- This dress code applies during all conference sessions, meetings, and competitive events

EXPECTED DRESS CODE

BUSINESS SUIT

Suit jacket and matching dress pants or skirt.



DRESS SHIRT OR BLOUSE

Button-up dress shirt or professional blouse.



DRESS SLACKS

Dress pants in black, navy, gray, or khaki.



SKIRT OR DRESS

Professional skirt or dress at or below the knee.



PROFESSIONAL SHOES

Dress shoes, flats, or heels.



SWEATER, CARDIGAN OR BLAZER

Acceptable to wear over dress shirt or blouse.



OFFICIAL DECA BLAZER

Optional.

JEANS, SHORTS, LEGGINGS WORN AS PANTS, OR ATHLETIC WEAR



T-SHIRTS OR HOODIES



TENNIS SHOES, FLIP-FLOPS, SLIDES, OR CASUAL SANDALS



CLOTHING WITH HOLES, RIPS, OR EXCESSIVE DISTRESSING



CROP TOPS, REVEALING CLOTHING, OR EXCESSIVELY SHORT SKIRTS
